Child Safeguarding Statement

Clonmel Rowing Club (CRC) is committed to safeguarding our junior members and all volunteers by working under the guidance of Rowing Ireland Safeguarding Policies and Children's First guidelines. It is best practice to ensure that all committee members, coaches, volunteers, and all working directly with our junior members in the club seek to create a safe environment for young people to grow and develop within our sport.

Procedure in place to manage risk identified

1. Risk assessment:

Risk identified

A Risk Assessment of Harm has been completed which indicates the areas of potential risk of harm, the likelihood of the risk occurring, and gives the required policy, guidance or process documents required to alleviate these risks.

CRC has a responsibility to ensure all volunteers and coaches are carefully selected, trained and supervised and have evidence of the following: Encouraged to complete Children's First training and provide acknowledgement of completion. Recruitment Sign and complete the National Vetting Bureau Form. Any past convictions or cases pending must be disclosed to the Club at the time of application. Coaching staff are aware of Safeguarding measures to both protect the junior members and

keep themselves safe.

2. Complaints & Discipline

• All members including juniors, adults, coaches, and parents are encouraged to be open at all times and to share any concerns or complaints that they have about any aspect of the club with the appropriate committee member. As per policy the complaints will be managed sensitively and fairly as per CRC's complaints policy.

3. Reporting Procedures

- Club appoints a Club Children's Officers (CCO/DLP) yearly to be ratified at the first management meeting after the AGM. The CCO is responsible for ensuring that the club is safe place for all junior athletes and for receiving and reporting any child protection concerns accordingly. DLP's role is to report any Child Protection concerns through the appropriate procedures in line with Children's First guidelines.
- It is also the duty of care of the coaching group to report on any concerns relating to child protection and welfare the club CCO/DLP
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- All the junior training is supervised by coaches.
 - All training sessions are pre-planned -days/times -land/water and coordinated amongst the coach's group and any changes are communicated to ensure that there is appropriate supervision and transparency.
 - All training rooms in the club house offer means to supervise any and all coaching to participants.

- CRC have relevant safety statements and guidelines to keep both the coaches and the junior members safe whilst using the club facilities (on and off the water) and at organized club events.
- CRC have an appointed Safety Officer to ensure that all health and safety risks are appropriately assessed and managed as per the Safety Statement.


3. Implementation:
